Learning to Do, Doing to Learn, Earning to Live, Living to Serve

Do you want to go to National Convention? To be eligible to attend National FFA Convention in Louisville, Kentucky, this year you need to be a high points winner for fruit and mum sales and participation points. Fruit and mum sales are worth 50% and participation points will be worth the other 50%. Three spots are reserved for freshman and seven will be for other members. Freshman eligibility: Top 3 combined fruit/mum sales and highest score on the FFA knowledge test. Other Members: Fruit/mum sales are 50% and participation points are 50% Costs to go: If you sell less than \$300 you pay \$200 If you sell \$301-\$399 you pay \$100 If you sell \$400-\$599 you pay \$75 If you sell \$600-\$800 you pay \$50 If you sell \$801 or more you go for free! The cost for the chapter will be \$250 to \$310 per person.
